

# HUSKIES WINTER SPORTS PREVIEW

## Young but now veteran, Huskies aim to move up on court

Sweet Home boys basketball is heading into the new season with a roster of players who have seen the varsity floor before.

They're a young team – the only seniors are Alex Bachand and Trenton Templin, but the rest of the team – six juniors and four sophomores, some of whom might swing, bring experience from a difficult 2024-25 season.

"That experience will help us a lot this year as we bring back most of our team." Said Coach Drew Emmert

The Huskies went 3-21 overall and 0-10 in league last season while facing a tough schedule and trying to score against strong defenses. With so many young players on the court, the team struggled to find consistency.

"Last season we were extremely young with a tough schedule," Emmert said.

Things look different this time around. Sweet Home returns nine varsity players, including three starters in guards Bradyn McClure, a junior, and sophomore Mason

Tyler, plus junior forward Kellen Hartsook. They'll be joined in the starting lineup by juniors Trent Harvey and Daniel McCubbins.

This year, they opened the season on Wednesday, Dec. 3, at home with a very competitive and close game against

3A Division Elmira, tying things up at halftime after a slow start before finally losing by a basket, 44-42. The Falcons are expected to move back to the 4A Division next year.

Other returning varsity players include juniors Kae-

son Walker and Gavin Tyler, while sophomores Sam Barringer, Kyler Bondesen and Damon Lawrence move up from last year's JV, giving the team more depth.

Junior Varsity players are Barringer and Bondesen, who will swing, juniors Kyle

Hagle, Gage Pettner and Noah Valdez, and sophomores Zeplin Berg, Evan Knight, Felix Lopez, Owen Nicholson and Russell Schroeder.

The Junior Varsity 2 roster is made up of freshmen Luke

## Girls look to continue forward strides in OWC basketball race

The Sweet Home girls basketball made big strides last season, and after not graduating any seniors, the Huskies believe they're ready for another step forward.

"Last season we showed drastic improvement from the previous year," Head Coach Erika Evans said of her team, which improved from a 0-10 league record and 1-19 overall record in 2023-24 to 1-9, 5-16 last year.

The Huskies improved their total points scored by over 300 points, and held it down on the defensive end, allowing 100 less points than the 23-24 season.

Sweet Home was able to capture its first league win in two years, beating Newport. The win was the Huskies' third in three seasons. The Huskies play in the Oregon West Conference which produced last year's eventual state champion Stayton, which beat fellow OWC member Philomath in the state final.

"We proved a lot to ourselves about what could be done with a young roster and a year of improvement," said Evans.

With the entire roster back and no seniors lost, Sweet Home enters the new season in a very different position. Instead of rebuilding, the Huskies are able to pick up right where they left off.

"I expect to build on last year's improvement, we're returning our entire roster, so we're able to start in the refinement process rather than building from the ground up," Evans said.

The Huskies have already started strong, opening the year with a win over Elmira – the program's first season-opening victory since 2021. The Huskies were down 13-3 late in the first quarter but battled back with tough de-

fense to win 37-33.

Then, on the road at Phoenix Dec. 5, the Huskies lost to a good team 46-40 in overtime,

"I was very, very, very proud of our girls," Evans said. "We were playing a really competitive and likely playoff team at Phoenix, and we went to overtime, and at points, we were down, like in the fourth quarter by eight points at one time, and we overcame that."

On Saturday, the Huskies beat Douglas 48-18.

"We had our biggest positive point in that every single person on our varsity roster had two or more rebounds, and every single person was in the pluses and the plus minus category," she said. "So that was great."

"We expect to have an extremely competitive season."

Sweet Home's starting lineup changes from game to game.

Their three seniors, Addy

Vannice, Loralai Mark and Aubrey Newberry, Evans says, set the tone for the program.

"They are going to be huge assets in terms of leadership. They've helped build the excitement around this season through their perseverance and hard work."

The rest of the roster includes juniors Mailey Brewer, Aaliyah Brown, Brooke Elder and Amara Gonzales, and sophomores Dymin Flowers, Taylor Gasky, Rylee Mabe, and Dinah Watkins.

The Huskies junior varsity roster is made up of juniors Jayla Moore and Khloe Wood; sophomores Kayla Bain, Flowers, Emma Graber, Adriana Morse and Dinah Watkins; and freshmen Aubree Bartlett, Allison Denuell, Kayla Matthews, Jocelyn Simmons, Tayler Sullivan and Braelyn Walker.

Adams, Jackson Burke, Ryder Cummings, Gavin Duran, Mason Flores, Brytin Greer, Max Lopez, Ayden Marin, Hunter McClure, Landon Messmer, Bryson Mumford, Gunnar Stafford, Landon Thomson and Marcus Warthen.

Sweet Home has lost three seniors to graduation – Josh

Aker, Jason Funk and Conner Pace – Aker and Pace both three-year starters; but the amount of experience coming back has the coaching staff feeling confident. The team also played a lot of games throughout the spring and summer, giving players extra time to grow and improve. "Our guys played a lot of games last spring and summer, and we are hoping to be very competitive this year..."

Our goal is to make a playoff game," Emmert said.

With an older, more familiar group on the floor, the Huskies hope all that practice and hard work leads to a much stronger season.

They played well in their opener against Elmira Dec. 3, losing 44-42 in the final minutes of the last quarter.

"I felt we dropped that one,"

Emmert said. The Huskies used tough D to beat Phoenix on the road 45-33, then lost at Douglas, a team that Emmert said could be in the playoffs, 53-35 less than 24 hours later, folding under defensive pressure.

"We didn't come out ready to play and although we were only down three going into

the final quarter, they had a big run."

The Oregon West Conference remains one of the most competitive leagues in the state, he said, but there may be more parity this year.

"We've played in the best league in the state the last five years or longer than that, but this year it's little more up in the air," he said. Cascade, which was seeded No. 1

in last year's state playoffs and finished third, losing in the semifinals to eventual champion Baker, saw significant departures to graduation and both Stayton and North Marion also saw departures on Graduation Day.

"I think we should fit into the mix," Emmert said. "I don't think there's a team in the league that will be as dominant."

Gillespie and Daniel Matthews, has helped the team understand the game in new ways and grow closer as a group.

With the program trending up, Evans hopes the community will show up and support the group.

"I want community members to come support this very special and hardworking group of young women," she said.

The Oregon West Confer-

ence has teams ranked first, second and fourth in the state, all of which return almost all their lineups from last year.

"It's definitely really tough competition," Evans said. "But we are really excited to show them something different in a game. I think we will shock them. We are definitely coming out swinging this year and I think we'll be more competitive in a lot of our league games."

# SH's swim numbers down, but experience returns

The Sweet Home High School swim team has grown used to racing at the front of the pack. Last winter, the program delivered one of its strongest showings in recent memory – the boys finished 5–2, taking second at districts and seventh at state, while the girls went 6–1, claiming the district title and placing second in the 4A/3A/2A/1A state championships.

But as the Huskies dive into a new season, head coach A Jay Bronson knows the lanes ahead will look different.

“We graduated 11 seniors,” Bronson said. “That’s always a big hit. I’d love to say we’re going to win districts again, but it’s going to be a much harder road this year. It’s possible – just not a lock like it has been.”

It’s also an unusual year for Sweet Home, at least recently: The boys outnumber the girls 10 to seven.

That’s a lighter turnout than the coach prefers. Ideally, he said, programs thrive with 10 to 14 swimmers per squad, giving teams the depth to pick up crucial fifth- and sixth-place points.

“Swimming is a numbers sport when you get down to

it,” Bronson said. “We might win a lot of events, but we may not always have the depth to win meets. Still, the smaller roster means more one-on-one time with our swimmers, and that can really help individual development.”

### Returning Firepower

The Huskies are far from starting over.

On the girls’ side, sophomore Khloe Sautel, a returning state champion in the 500 freestyle, headlines the group. Sweet Home also expects strong pushes from junior Lexi Rundell, and senior Kylie Melkvik and junior Ella Haggas, all of whom could be state qualifiers.

The girls roster also includes sophomore Emma Whitton and freshmen Persephone Brookfield and Sadie Dalton. Bronson said the freshmen are already showing varsity potential.

For the boys, Bronson hopes to send multiple relays to state and expects leadership from four key returners: senior Andrew Tolman, junior Austyn Hogan, junior Henry Jones, and sophomore Grayson Savri.

“We think the boys have a real chance to medal in relays,” Bronson said. “Andrew, Grayson and Austyn – they all have the potential to

reach the podium individually too, if they put in the work.”

### New Faces, Early Waves

A welcome influx of juniors buoyed the boys’ roster, thanks to successful recruiting by team captains.

Ethan Hernandez, a junior who stands 6-5, caught Bronson’s attention early. “Height helps in every aspect of the sport,” he said. “He’ll be a good one to watch.”

Freshman Marshal Van Dijk has also impressed with what Bronson called “incredible work ethic.”

Also on the roster are juniors Hackett Hotchkiss and Thomas Culbertson, and

freshmen

Westin Burns and Mack Martineau.

### Setting the Bar

With depth thinner than in recent years, Sweet Home is shifting its focus.

“A successful season would be about best times across the board,” Bronson said.

“If we can qualify two relays each for boys and girls and get four or five individuals to state, we’ll be happy.”

Bronson said reaching the second day of the state meet – and stepping onto the podium – would be a major accomplishment for a team rebuilding on the fly.

### Schedule Highlights

Sweet Home opens the season at home with the Sweet Home Meet on Dec. 5, followed by a home dual against Marist Catholic on Dec. 19.

One of the marquee moments of the winter arrives Jan. 3, when Sweet Home hosts the “Peargin Plunge” Sweet Home Invite, named in honor of longtime coach Doug Peargin. Beyond being a home showcase, Bronson said the meet gives the Huskies a rare and valuable look at contenders from outside their district.

“It’s a great chance to see

# Wrestling teams expect big things with strong returnees

After a state runner-up finish on the boys side last year, Head Coach Steve Thorpe is hungry for more than just his 11th straight state trophy.

"The expectation is that the boys bring home a state title," Thorpe stated.

He continued: "(I want the boys to also be) regional champs and Oregon Classic Champs. I want the girls to trophy at state and be regional champions."

The boys team did bring home the 4A Division crown at the Oregon Classic last year and were regional champions, but ultimately fell short at the state tournament to Crook County, which outscored Sweet Home 319 points to 284.5 in the final tally.

But the good news is that many of last year's state qualifiers are back, including four champions, led by two-time state champion junior Jesse Landroop; senior Tytus Hardee, who won his first state title after placing twice before, senior Dillan Davis, whose won his first state championship, and junior Riley Vaughan, who also won his first title last season.

The Huskies have lost some beef from last year's team, which steamrolled their way to the state tournament, qualifying 18 wrestlers for state. Twelve of them were still alive on Day 2.

Gone are Colton Bennett, Russell Dickerman, Jacob Landroop and Dylan Sharp, all of whom placed at state.

Also gone is senior Ashton Swanson, a state champion as a junior who was presumed to repeat, but was disqualified at the regional tournament due to a personal foul that suspended him for the



what teams around the state have to offer," he said.

"I'm excited to see how we stack up and get a taste of what state might look like this year. It really helps us measure where we are and what we need to work on."

Sweet Home hosts invitationals again on Jan. 16, Jan. 23 and Jan. 31 before a dual against Salem Academy on Feb. 6. The postseason begins Feb. 13-14 at the Special District 4 Championships in Albany.

The second annual alumni meet - a "Green vs. Gold" showdown - will take place the day after Christmas. Bronson expects it to be one of the most spirited days of the year.

Last year's inaugural event drew some 26 Huskies from the past, including school record-setters and

state champions.

**Experienced Staff**

As Sweet Home gears up for another winter in the water, the team is guided by one of the most seasoned and dedicated coaching groups in Oregon.

Head Coach Bronson enters his 15th year of coaching high school swimming, his fifth at Sweet Home, and is joined by returning assistant coaches Jess Rice (seventh year) and Mark Cirkosz (fourth year).

Rounding out the staff is legendary Doug Peargin, now in his 57th season coaching, 51 of them at Sweet Home.

Together, the coaching group brings roughly 83 years of combined swim-coaching experience and, as Bronson notes, a shared commitment not only to team success but to helping each athlete grow as an individual.

**Leadership in the Lanes**

This year's student captains Andrew Tolman, Austyn Hogan and Kylie Melkvik have already made their presence felt.

"They've done a great job recruiting and setting an example," Bronson said. "At practice, they're talking, encouraging their teammates - what you want from leaders."

Tolman is hopeful, "Despite losing over half of our team last year, I believe we can still do good this year, even with half of our swimmers being new to the team. I have already seen so much improvement in all of them."

Even with a smaller roster, Bronson believes the Huskies have the heart and hunger to make the most of every race.

"I'm hopeful," he said. "They've been working really hard. If they stay committed, I think we're going to surprise people."

state tournament, and whose absence cost the Huskies.

"I don't want to talk about those guys," Thorpe said. "We'll talk about what I have this year."

On the girls side, three-time state qualifier and two-time champ Bailey Chafin, now a senior, returns along with three other state qualifiers: junior Madi Looney, and sophomores Bella Rico and Lyla Ventura.

Chafin had to default out of the final last year with a badly injured knee, which gave out in the match, that she has worked to rehabilitate over the past year.

The Huskies add a new freshmen class, one that "has a lot of experience through the Mat Club," per Thorpe.

Twenty of the 48 wrestlers on the boys roster are freshmen and four ninth-graders join the nine sophomores, three juniors and two seniors on the girls side.

"Kass Zajic is the leader and most experienced of these freshmen girls," Thorpe said. "Cody Sieminski and Macen Rosa are the most accomplished on the guys' side."

In addition to the returning boys state champions, junior Kyle Zajic is back after a runner-up finish in last year's finals; along with senior Luke Rosa, third last year and a two-time state placer; senior Jeremiah Steagall, third last year and a three-time state placer; junior Keegan Jefferson, third last year and a two-time state placer; and sophomore Eli Cruz, who was fifth last year at 175 pounds as a freshman.



On Saturday, Dec. 6, the boys competed at the Perry Burlison Tournament hosted by Cascade, finishing second behind Soldotna, Alaska, a 5A-sized school, 220-213.

For the Huskies, Jesse Landroop (126), Tytus Hardee (132) and Jeremiah Steagall (190) won individual championships.


Placing second, were Cody Sieminski (113) and Riley Vaughan (120).
